Police Law

Police Law:

Jennie acts on behalf of police forces in cases touching upon all aspects of police law. She is particularly experienced in civil actions (claims for wrongful arrest and false imprisonment, personal injury, compromise of personal data, discrimination, and misfeasance in public office) and actions under the Human Rights Act.

She has also advised on the use of Covert Human Intelligence Sources and the interception of communications data under the Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act 2000 and Investigatory Powers Act 2016. She is particularly experienced in matters of sensitive operational policing, counter-terrorism and the use of covert sources and witness protection measures.

Jennie is experienced in asset recovery; restraint orders, account forfeiture orders and the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002. She is regularly instructed to represent forces in judicial reviews of policing decisions.

She regularly represents forces and other public bodies at inquests and inquiries, with a particular specialism in deaths in police custody.

- **XXX v A Constabulary [2019]**: Claim under the Data Protection Act 1998 and Human Rights Act in respect of the placement of a child in a witness protection programme.
- **T v A Constabulary [2019]**: Misfeasance in public office allegation in respect of alleged misconduct by an officer during a lengthy investigation into fraudulent trading;
- **B v A Constabulary [2019]**: Claim arising from a deliberate disclosure of personal data by a serving police officer;
- **EXB v GSX [2019]**: High Court claim under the Human Rights Act for damages in respect of the treatment whilst in witness protection.
- **Inquest into the death of JP [2019]**: Inquest into the death of a young man killed by armed police officers after he took his girlfriend hostage in his flat. Represented the constabulary.
- **Inquest into the death of JM [2018]** Murder of a prisoner whilst in custody. Represented the constabulary.

Crime

Crime:

Jennifer is regularly instructed alone and as a led junior in offences of serious violence, sexual offences, drugs, fraud and organised crime. She is described by her instructing solicitors as a "tenacious and talented advocate" who "brings a professional, friendly and straightforward approach to proceedings."

Jennifer has developed a practice in serious and complex fraud, having completed a secondment with the Serious Fraud Office in 2014. She was part of the disclosure team that led to the first successful prosecution of a Hedge Fund manager in the UK for conspiracy to defraud.

Alongside her practice, Jennifer teaches Criminal Litigation and Advocacy at BPP Law School. She is a co-author of "Criminal Litigation, Evidence and Sentencing" and supervises students undertaking the LLM in Professional Legal Practice.

- **R v M, Inner London CC**: Defendant charged with laundering half a million pounds across four jurisdictions through his Western Union money transfer business.
- **R v B, Manchester CC**: Led junior. Defendant charged with kidnap and attempted murder. Successful submission of no case to answer based on extensive analysis of cell site evidence in the absence of an expert.
- **R v K, Croydon CC**: Defendant charged with faking own death after fleeing country to avoid allegations of benefit fraud. Extensive media coverage.
- **R v D, Birmingham CC**: Defendant charged with rape and false imprisonment.

Jennifer has substantial experience working in an international context. Prior to her career at the Bar, she participated in criminal justice and human rights projects in Kenya, Uganda and India.

Jennifer currently works with the Turkish Bar Association to write and deliver ECHR compliant cross examination training to lawyers and judges across Turkey. She is accredited as an advocacy trainer for both the Advocacy Training Council and the Inner Temple. In 2015, she became and ADR group accredited International Mediation Advocate.

In 2016 she trained government lawyers in Rwanda on professional negligence and contract negotiation in association with the Department For International Development.
